

Poverty Prevalence 15.8 % Poverty Depth 5.8 % Mamprugu Maogduri is one of the districts in the Northern Region. The district shares boundaries with North Gonja District to the West, Kumbungu District to the south, Sisala East in the Upper West Region, Builsa South in the Upper East Region and West Mamprusi District in the Northern Region. Mamprugu Maogduri has a population of 52,540 out of which 26,279 are females and 26,261 are males. The boxes below contain relevant economic indicators such as per capita expenditure and poverty prevalence for a better understanding of its development.



Infographic I: Demo Plots in Mamprugu Maogduri, 2014-2015

Mamprugu Maogduri accounted for a beneficiaries* decent number of throughout the period 2014-2016, especially in 2014. A few demo plots have been established to provide training about new technologies to the beneficiaries and a few nucleus farmers are operating in the area. No agricultural loans were received as shown on Table I. The beneficiaries score improved in 2015 and 2016. But since the number of beneficiaries is not the only consideration taken into account in the presence score, the presence score in Mamprugu Maogduri is I.4 out of 4. This shows that the intervention there is below average as compared to other districts. There is not enough information to suggest a district flag.






Figure 2: Household Composition by Group Age, 2015

Mamprugu Maogduri has a population of 52,540 out of

which 26,279 are females and 26,261 are males. The district lies in the tropical continental climacteric zone. Average precipitation and temperature are similar to the other districts in the Northern Region. Figure 3 shows average maximal and minimal temperatures as well as yearly average precipitation. Mamprugu Maogduri has a very young population as Figure 2 shows, with 46% of the population falling in the age range: 0 to 14 years old. This is also shown clearly in the age pyramid.
