Roland Quainno, the CEO of Run On Time Engineering Limited, previously limited his business to serving the mining sector and was hesitant in allowing NGOs and other donor programs to enter into his business space and provide support. However, after much persistence from the Ghana SCD Program team where he saw how their passion for excellence and potential for growth matched his own, Mr. Quainno sampled a number of SCD training and events, including Environment Health & Safety (EHS), Quality Management Systems (QMS), and Business Development trainings.

After attending the trainings, Mr. Quainno wasted no time implementing the knowledge he acquired and shared his lessons learned with his employees. To date, Run On Time has put in place various procedures for both visitors and workers who enter his premises:

- His premises are now well structured with a security log-in and training room for staff
- Staff go through consistent training to upgrade their knowledge on industry trends
- Staff are also required to read books from the internal library for 30 minutes each day to encourage learning
- Audits have been completed including ISO 9001 and OHSAS 18001 and the company is also in the process of acquiring Petroleum Commission registration.

Due to his desire to grow and passion for excellence, Mr. Quainno’s business was recently selected for the General Electric (GE) SME Development Program. Due to his accomplishments, Mr. Quainno was also invited to share his experiences at various conferences including the CWC Oil and Gas Summit and Ghana Skills Gap Summit.

He is a focused and determined business leader that has demonstrated that success comes from hard work and learning adaptations.
